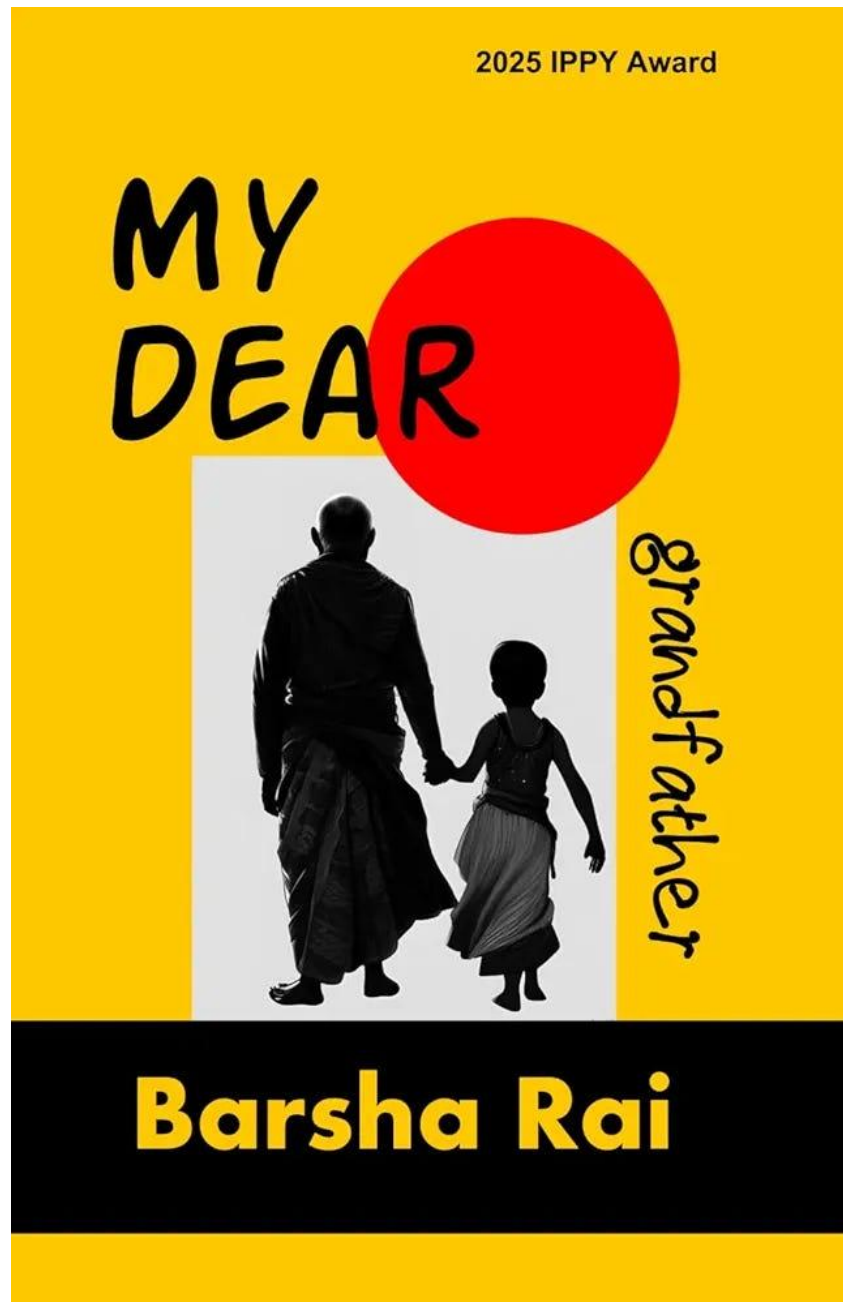


The Power of Silence in My Dear Grandfather
